Rib until the end of the row. Next row cast on 12 stitches and continue in the rib pattern for 20 rows. Right side: Rib 21 stitches, then cast off 30 for the neck. Rib 21 stitches. Next row rib 21 stitches. Cast on 30 stitches. Rib 21 stitches. Repeat for 20 rows. Wrong side: Cast off 12 stitches (to finish the sleeve). Next row cast off another 12 stitches. Continue 30 rows of stocking stitch. Then rib 16 rows of 2 plain, 2 purl and then cast off and sew up the side seams. This pattern is all knitted in one piece.
